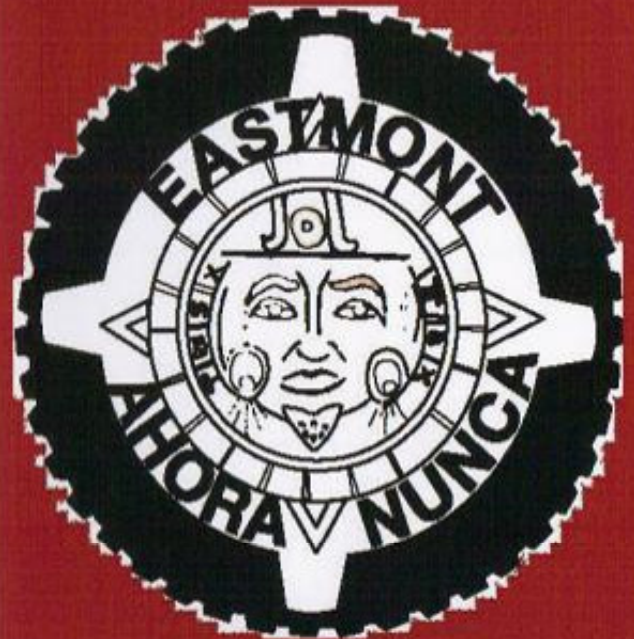

## Our Programs

### Family & Senior Services

Eastmont Staff courteously assist low-income families and seniors with case management services, emergency food and clothing, transportation, education, health care and referral services for employment opportunities.

### Academia del Pueblo

Academia del Pueblo is an after-school education enrichment program for students in grades 1 through 3 enrolled in local elementary schools. Learning curriculum and activities individualized following evaluation of reading and writing skills. Parents are encouraged to become involved in learning activities and educational field trips are also featured learning opportunities.



### Emergency Food Pantry

Eastmont staff prepares nutritional "food bags" for distribution to low-income Seniors and families in need.

### Wise Buy Thrift Shop

Eastmont staff manages a clothing and housing items shop which distributes needed items to low-income families and Seniors.

## Service Partners

### Child Care & Learning

Pre-kindergarten educational classes are conducted by VOALA Head Stat partners trained to instruct children up to 4 years old in development of social skills, team work and early development skills.



### Senior Hot Meals

Casa Maravilla staff provides highly nutritional lunches Monday through Friday, in addition to social activities and musical entertainment.

Community Partners also provide low-impact exercise activities for seniors.

### ESL Classes

Montebello Unified School District provides English-As-A-Second Language and Citizenship Preparation classes Monday-Thursday.
